### 7.02 Instruction Updates

- a. The staff has selected our three main goal areas to focus on this year and they are SEL, math and literacy. SEL and math are continuing from last year and we rolled our language acquisition goal to our new literacy goal. The staff math half-day professional development session for staff increased our knowledge of the math learning experiences and highlighted some new pieces about math assessments. We will continue to focus on math throughout the year and will have a S'now Better Time to be a mathematician day and evening events for parents on Thursday, January 31, more details coming after the first of the year. I was fortunate enough to attend the regional NCTM (National Council of Mathematics Teachers) conference and a Jo Boaler conference, Ms. Boaler is a well-respected math education professor at Stanford University, and look forward to sharing with the staff and parents in the next few months.
- b. We have received another shipment of SEL focused books from the district that will be housed in our bookroom for the teachers to use for their SEL lessons.
- c. Report cards will be coming home this Friday, November 16, please look in your child's backpack for them.
- d. Erin's law fall lessons (child sexual abuse prevention) have concluded and there will be a second round in spring.
- e. Students in grades 3-5 students will participated in an SEL (Social Emotional Learning) survey called the Panorama, which is aligned to Illinois State Social Emotional Learning Standards and aims to give educators and students a measure of how students are developing a growth-mindset, grit, self-management, and social awareness. Results are used to plan at both at the district and building level to inform our SEL instruction.

- b. Our Phil's Friends kick off assembly was very well organized and received by all.
